TELL ME WHAT YOU SEE

Amber Sloan's solo "Tell Me What You See" is influenced by Quantum Mechanics' "observer effect" that states that the process of observing a particle changes the way the particle behaves. The work questions how watching or being watched alters both the dancer and audience's experience. She references a 2D graph of an observed massive particle traveling from Point A to Point B through space and time as a spatial pattern to guide her trajectory within a 3D landscape.

"Proteia" is a solo work inspired by Paige's reimagined creation story of quantum mechanics. In her unique take on the Greek myth of Proteus, she introduces Proteus's fictional twin sister, Proteia, who surpasses all in the magical arts of shape-shifting and fortune-telling. Consumed by jealousy, Proteus inadvertently shrinks Proteia down to the size of an atom. Trapped in this microscopic universe, Proteia's existence gives rise to the very principles of quantum mechanics.

"Kathak is an ancient Indian storytelling dance form that allows me to reach diverse audiences. It also enables me to form connections between tradition and modernity. I created 'Quantum Dances' as an extension of the questions; Is the Ancient Indian understanding of the Universe similar to some of the current scientific ideologies? What are the rules that govern the world around us? The dance between order and disorder, or the rhythmicity in the numerical patterns, are as intangible as dance itself. Yet, somehow, we can imagine them. In this piece, the scientist's and artist's curiosity collide, exploring the wonders of the universe."

"Spin Sisters" blends the classical grace of ballet with the mind-bending principles of quantum entanglement. Three dancers, encased in voluminous hoop skirts weave intricate patterns, their movements mirroring each other despite vast distances on stage. This quirky yet technically demanding piece uses

Tchaikovsky's timeless score to explore the whimsical paradox of interconnectedness at a subatomic level.

SAMEENA MITTA (Artistic Director/Choreographer)

Sameena is artistic director of dance-theater company MeenMoves and its outreach program MadHops. Mitta was a 2022/23 Artist in Residence at 92NY Harkness Dance Center, a NJPAC Choreography Fellow 2019-2022, and received a 2023 Choreographic Fellowship award from the Mid Atlantic Arts Foundation. She has presented works at Little Island, 92NY, NJPAC, BAM Fisher, Americas Society, Ailey Studio Theatre, Martha Graham Theatre, Judson Church and many other venues around NYC and around the world. Mitta has produced live events including International Women's Day of Dance and co-produced international digital events with 1014 Space For Ideas. Mitta recently completed an intergenerational dance film Bilateral Quadrennium and continues work on a 10-year site-specific dance film project Struwwelpeter. Mitta earned with distinction the Cecchetti Society's Diploma and a MA in Dance Creation from Université du Québec à Montréal focusing on Movement Intervention for South Asian survivors of domestic violence. Under Mitta's artistic direction, MeenMoves explores questions of identity, focusing on the unique perspectives of those who check "none-of-the-above", to create socially relevant, quirky, highly-technical dance-theater works for stage and film. Mitta advocates for diversity in dance and has sat on multiple dance juries for granting agencies in Canada and the USA. Mitta is mentor to the Recanati-Kaplan scholars in dance, she is the Harkness Dance Center Artistic Advisor, and she is on faculty at the Limón Institute, 92NY, and Marymount College. MAITHILI PATEL (Choreographer/Performer)

Maithili is a Kathak artist and choreographer from New Jersey dedicated to telling stories that celebrate and challenge traditional narratives. Kathak, a storytelling artform, has enabled her to create meaningful experiences for diverse audiences. She continues to explore and expand her movement vocabulary to express contemporary themes, while always striving to honor her roots. Under the mentorship of Guru Dr. Pali Chandra, Maithili has been fortunate to share her work globally, performing at events such as The Dubai Kathak Festival, The London Parliament House of Lords, and The Modhera Dance Festival. An avid storyteller, her piece Draupadi, choreographed by Dr. Chandra, received acclaim at the New York Kathak Festival 2019, while her dance film Rise, addressing domestic abuse, resonated deeply at the Swiss International Kathak Festival 2020. Through her art, she remains committed to encourage dialogue, cultural understanding, and inspire others to think more deeply about the world around us.




PAIGE BARNETT KULBETH (Choreographer/Performer)
